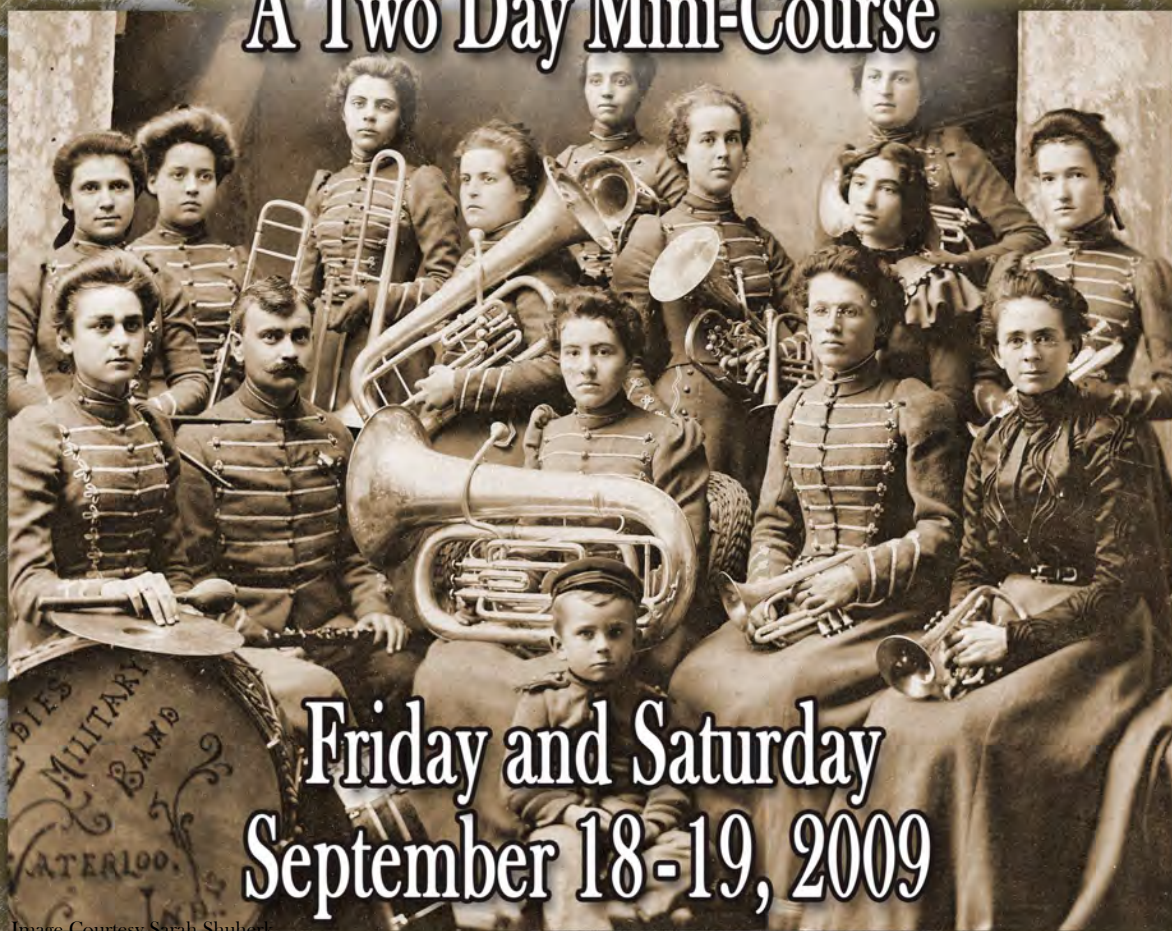

The Mini-Course Concept

The Genealogy Center mini-courses are an exciting new series of educational workshops featuring an invigorating combination of expert lectures, individual consultations and assisted research in the vast resources available at the Allen County Public Library. The compact, two day mini-courses will be offered quarterly, and cover a variety of topics of interest to the family historian. Researchers will have the opportunity to benefit from top-notch instruction and then immediately apply what they have learned in the extensive collections of the Genealogy Center. Attendees will begin each day with classroom instruction presented by experts on the subject. A guided tour of the Genealogy Center will round out the first day and both days will feature time for assisted research and consultations with the instructors and Genealogy Center staff. Students will receive a packet of instructional materials, and be provided with snacks during morning and afternoon breaks to help keep everyone energized! Lunch is on your own, so attendees may choose to brown bag or eat at one of the many local restaurants within a short walk of the library. The new mini-course format offers genealogists a quality educational experience at a very modest price. Attendance is limited, so please register early to avoid disappointment.

Meet Your Instructors

Margery Graham, Certified Genealogist, has 28 years of genealogy experience. She is past president of the Allen County Genealogical Society of Indiana and a 26 year member of ACGSI. She has been an instructor of the Elderhostel genealogy classes for the Allen County Public Library Foundation and previously for the University of Saint Francis. Marge also worked several summers as a reference assistant in the Genealogy Center of the Allen County Public Library. She continues to volunteer there, having surpassed 2000 hours. In May 2006, she accepted the position of Allen County Genealogist representing the Indiana Genealogical Society. The vital records office of Allen County also benefits from Marge's volunteer time spent filling requests for birth and death records.

Steven W. Myers, M.L.S. has been a reference librarian and assistant manager of the Genealogy Center at the Allen County Public Library for the past 23 years. An avid genealogist since 1973, he has served on the boards of several national genealogical organizations, and in 1991 received the Federation of Genealogical Societies' "Distinguished Service Award." Besides his genealogical publishing projects, Steve enjoys lecturing at national, state and local seminars. He has taught an Irish genealogical research course periodically over the last ten years and was co-leader of the National Genealogical Society's Research Trip to Ireland in 2001. Steve has conducted on-site research in 66 courthouses in 7 states, as well as in record offices in Canada, England, Ireland and Scotland.

Its collection of English language genealogy and local history periodicals is the nation's largest. Each year the Center draws to its door thousands of visitors who welcome its central location in the Midwest, the ease of access to its collection, and the depth of its holdings.
